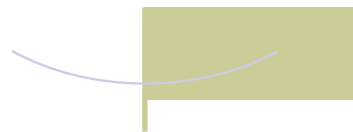

The pricing has been adjusted to reflect the new smaller size of the paper bags we are forced to purchase. Also, plastic bags will no longer be used to provide handles for the paper bags for ecological and financial reasons and because the handles often tore.

Approximately 10,000 books will be available, most going for only a dollar a book. Book sales net about \$3,000 each. All monies go to the library for programs and materials. Money is also raised through the ongoing book sales within the library.

If you have books to donate to these sales, there is a large wooden drop box to the left of the Library front door as you enter. Please recycle as you read. Then everyone can read everything.

A Message from Max Leek Library Director

Will the Library Close?

I keep hearing that the libraries will close. This is what I hear: "I was at a party," and earnest library lover will say, "and they were saying that the library is going to close because there isn't any money." Pause. "Is that true?"

There are two questions there. I don't waste time on the easy one. The easy one can be phrased this way: "If there isn't any money, will the libraries close?" The answer to that question is, "Yes." Libraries provide "free" services, but free services cost money. The question I answer is this one:

"Will our libraries in Douglas County close their doors?" I answer, "No." I think the libraries will stay open because our libraries are essential to our communities, and our communities recognize their value. Therefore, our communities will pay the price, in time, treasure, passion, and advocacy, to maintain our libraries. And if we are willing to pay, however we can pay, we will keep our libraries open.

That's not the same thing as saying, "Don't worry. The libraries will take care of themselves." It will take effort and commitment on

the part of the entire community to come together to maintain the valuable community resource which is the public library. The most sensible course will be a local tax to support the library system; a committee of the Douglas County Library System is working on that process.

We'll keep our libraries open, because we agree with Walter Cronkite: "Whatever the cost of our libraries, the price is cheap compared to that of an ignorant nation."
